Project Abstract

The School District of Palm Beach County, Florida, proposes to implement a three-year Magnet Schools Assistance Program (MSAP) grant project designed to offer five new magnet schools of choice to students and families in Palm Beach County. The five targeted schools are proposed to be converted into school-wide magnet programs offering a high caliber, student interest-driven, rigorous curriculum that will raise the academic achievement at each school site.
